### Facts:

- Capital city of Germany with an urban setting and historical legacy
- 3.3 million population

### Transport:

Berlin is easily accessible by air, road and rail, with flights taking only approx. 2hrs.

Travelling to Berlin: Berlin served by two commercial airports: Tegel Airport being the largest and located within Berlin, and the smaller Schönefeld Airport which is situated just outside of Berlin.
