Unique features:

Manchester Central offers a range of different spaces to suit every requirement, making use of state-of-the-art equipment and technology to provide a unique and memorable experience.

The venue boasts a moveable wall system which can create self-contained meeting rooms or be taken down to create additional floor space for networking. The central meeting rooms can be made to accommodate up to 170 delegates theatre style. They are adjacent to Central Hall and ideally located for breakout sessions.

The Central Hall is a column-free space that can be used for conventional exhibition layouts or for more unusual installations which can benefit from the height and unique character of the building.

The auditorium is purpose-built with 804 seats and state-of-the-art facilities capable of meeting the most sophisticated audio-visual requirements..

The Exchange Hall is a multi-purpose space with the flexibility to allow maximum creativity and can be used for trade exhibitions, event hospitality, conference seating and large-scale banqueting.

Transport to Manchester Central

From the airport, the city is approximately 25 minutes away by taxi or just 20 minutes via the half-hourly express rail service.

It is a 20 minute walk from Piccadilly Station or five minutes by taxi. Alternatively, you can catch a connecting train from Piccadilly to Oxford Road Station which is a five minute walk from Manchester Central.
